Our first tournament eligible for player of the year points is the Annual Powerball played on February 2. This letter will be out before the winners are crowned but it marks the beginning of tournament season. The first major of the year, the Match Play Championship will begin in March. Sign up forms will be in the pro shop on February 3 - If the field is large enough we will break it into senior and overall brackets. In April our second major, the Open Club Championship, is scheduled for April 5-6, the weekend before the Masters. Keep in mind that majors award the most player of the year points.

The loyalty system is up and running and members will begin accumulating points on February 1. As of right now, loyalty points will be awarded for carts, user fees and pro shop merchandise - we may expand to the snack bar after a few months of testing in the pro shop. There will be four levels in the loyalty program - silver, gold, platinum and diamond - all members will start at the gold level which is 1 point for every dollar spent on eligible products. Once a certain amount of points is accumulated you will be able to redeem items in the pro shop such as cart fees and certain merchandise items. Once certain thresholds are met, you'll be promoted to higher levels of the program which increase the point value per dollar spent. This program will run automatically in the background with any purchase and we hope it will add more value to your membership.

Lastly, it's supposed to snow this week so I don't think the course will be too busy but hope to see everyone playing when the front passes out of here.

- o A \$10 finance charge will be added to all unpaid balances each month.
- o We will be enforcing the DRESS CODE. Please wear collared shirts ... and tuck in shirt tails! NO cut-off jeans.
- o Tennis court reservations will be made at Miler Pro Shop.
- o Members observed riding on carts without checking in the Pro Shop for proper payment will be assessed a cart rental for 18 holes - no exceptions!

- o For slow-playing groups, please allow other groups waiting behind you to play through.
- o Do NOT tee off on #10 first WITHOUT checking in the Pro Shop. Tee times are arranged for groups to start on #1 tee.
- o Please do not leave your children unattended in the clubhouse. No one under the age of 21 is allowed in the bar after 4:30 pm unless attending a club special event.
